Thank you for the submission of your field survey for Pennsylvania Natural Diversity Inventory (PNDI) Environmental Review Receipt Number **602909** (Final\_2) for review. PA Department of Conservation and Natural Resources screened this project for potential impacts to species and resources under DCNR's responsibility, which includes plants, terrestrial invertebrates, natural communities, and geologic features only.

## No Impact Anticipated per Habitat Avoidance

PNDI records indicate species or resources under DCNR's jurisdiction are located in the vicinity of the project. *Quercus shumardii* (Shumard's Oak; PA Endangered) is known from the project area. As such it is requested that stream bank habitat is avoided and suitably buffered by project activities.

This response represents the most up-to-date review of the PNDI data files and is valid for two (2) years only. If project plans change or more information on listed or proposed species becomes available, our determination may be reconsidered. Should the proposed work continue beyond the period covered by this letter and a permit has not been acquired, please resubmit the project to this agency as an "Update" (including an updated PNDI receipt, project narrative, description of project changes and accurate map). As a reminder, this finding applies to potential impacts under DCNR's jurisdiction only.
